## There are a lot of reasons that people can't always be together in person.

Natural disasters, personal medical issues, weather-related events, transportation issues, and even global pandemics. And while some circumstances are more extreme than others, it's important for churches to know how to keep your community connected, when you can't connect in person.

Fortunately, there are a lot of new technologies and great ideas for your church to keep being the church, even when you can't be at church.

Here are a few ways that your church can thrive during the COVID-19 pandemic.





# 1 Encourage Together on Mobile

Just about everyone has a mobile device, and they are checking it constantly for updates, insights, and tidbits to guide their day. They might not even know just how much the communication they receive - for better or worse - impacts their thinking, decisions, and overall mood.

*Consider sending individuals or groups messages with Scripture, quotes, or statistics that remind them of the goodness of God, His hand in all of our lives, and how a proper perspective can lead to good outcomes, regardless of the situation.*

This is especially helpful when you need to send messages to people and segments in your church that you may not have on the top of your mind. # 2 Worship Together with Livestream



Youtube, Instagram, Facebook, and other social media platforms have live-streaming capabilities that are not too difficult to learn and implement. What's harder is capturing good audio and quality video with good lighting. But don't let limitations in technology limit your worship. If you can't afford the best equipment, you can set the proper expectations. For instance, if your church is smaller, maybe put the camera closer and have a more intimate worship session. If you think it's a priority you should invest in, hire a consultant and make the most of it.

*Whatever you do, don't stop worshipping together. People need to be reminded of who God is in times of turmoil, and nothing refocuses us and strengthens our faith like being "with" other people in worship services.*

If you can't sufficiently capture the audio of your worship band, pare it down to an acoustic set. And if you just can't get the music to work, at the very least provide a message so your people can keep the rhythm of learning and inspiration.

One difficulty with live-streaming is getting everyone to watch it at the same time. One way to ensure everyone in your church has access to your messages and worship is to use Realm to message groups and the entire church, notifying them that you are about to, or have already had a service, and share the link to the video.



# 3 Pray Together in Online Groups

Prayer has probably always been the behind-the-scenes power-play winner in ministry. Small bands of individuals and groups fervently praising and petitioning God has undergirded the strength, health, and growth of the Church for centuries. And now, we can add even more potency to the power of prayer by giving people a platform to make prayer requests known and share praise reports.

*Leverage mobile devices, texts, and social media platforms to give people an opportunity to ask for prayer.*

Then have your prayer team or church members actually “pray out loud” by writing their prayers on the forum you’ve chosen. Then encourage people to respond with praise reports about how God is moving in their lives.

Consider creating a discussion group on Realm where you can group people together into segments that will be most effective in praying together. Then an admin can track all the prayer requests and monitor activity to facilitate a robust and vibrant online prayer life at your church!

# 4 Study Together Using Forums



People still need to learn. In fact, when people are sidelined due to extenuating circumstances, they are even more likely to find mind-occupying activities. Like online groups, forums give participants the ability to share resources, discuss them, and consume teachings.

*A simple and powerful recipe for leveraging online forums is:*

- **Post a video or written resource with a particular teaching.**
- **Discuss the materials, answering any questions your students or attendees have.**
- **Give an assignment to the students and attendees.**
- **Discuss the assignment answers.**
- **Assign next steps, activities, or follow-up learning.**

Essentially, you're simply adding structure to a group discussion so everyone can be intentional about learning together.

The ability to share resources is extremely useful - and almost indispensable - when learning in an online group setting. # 5 Give Together with Online Donations

A lot of churches depend on in-person donations to sustain their monthly budgets. For those churches, times of disbursement in their population pose great difficulty and a great opportunity.

Now is the time to stress the importance of online giving. Not only does it fill the gap in times of absence but also it creates consistency with recurring giving, online pledges, and special funds.

It's important to communicate to your church, that now more than ever, the Body of Christ needs financial support to continue the operations of the church and to meet the special and unique needs of the community.

You might want to set up or promote an existing special relief fund (benevolence) or staff support fund to make sure that everyone's needs are met. You could also ask for people to set up recurring giving or make a pledge toward future initiatives that have been put on pause due to the extenuating circumstances.

*Whatever you do, don't stop talking about, teaching on, and encouraging people about giving.*

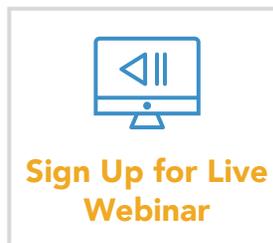

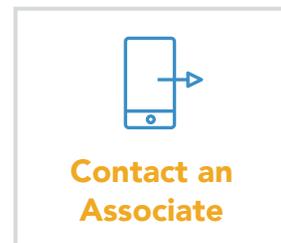
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
